

Probably 1937 or early 38 No date, George Farhat to Anton and Na'ame Karra'a

Note at the top: We received this letter from your son George.

Dear Uncle Anton and Aunt Na'ame, and Aunt Liza and her husband Ibrahim.

Greetings and I wish you full health. My father took me away from you, my dear Uncle and now I am in a situation that is worse than before because they beat me up every day. I am very, very upset. I am trying not to appear upset so they will forget. Please send me letters to the school. Have my mother send me the money so I can travel to her – and I can leave immediately. Do not worry about me because I do not forget what to do (unreadable) and send me the letter to the Latin School in Ramallah Palestine, George Farhat. Send me about half a pound so I can come to you and answer me immediately to the address written here. Do not worry because I will receive it provided you send it by registered mail. Peace to all your children, from Mr. George Farhat Latin School for Boys. Send me an answer immediately,

These markings will indicate to you that it's from me; you also do the same markings.
