

1938 Apr 23 Nicholas Sa'ade to Katherine – permission for George at Mex Consulate in Jerusalem

Formerly Saade letter 1 1938
From Saltillo, Mexico to San Francisco,

April 23rd 1938

We hope that this letter finds everyone in good health and doing well.

We inform you that we have previously written to you to let you know that the lawyer is working to bring the boy to this country, and we're corresponding back and forth with him. Today we received a telegram from him saying that the matter of the boy Girgy (George) is done, and that the government sent a telegram to the Mexican consul in Jerusalem to deliver to him papers for entry into Mexico, and asking us for the money. And on the same day we advanced the money to him. We phoned him to ask him for details. We sent this telegram to our sister Jamileh in Long Beach, California. We wrote to her that she should send the telegram back to us after she reads it because we need it. And in my opinion the telegram has reached the Mexican consul in Jerusalem, and the consul should request that our father in Bethlehem bring Girgy Farhat to the consulate so they can prepare the papers to enter Mexico. You should write from your end to Bethlehem asking them to act diligently. This is all for now.
